|             | Each tee marker is hand crafted from native sandstone. The markers are approximately 3 feet wide and 2.5 feet tall. The course logo, hole number, par and yard-ages are sandblasted into the stone and painted. A bronze plaque on the stone displays the donor's name.  |                |
| <b>#302</b> | <b>Tee Bench</b>   | <b>\$300</b>   |
|             | Attractive benches placed at each tee add beauty to any golf course. A brass plaque placed on the back of the bench displays the donor's name.   |                |
| <b>#303</b> | <b>Tree</b>  | <b>\$300</b>   |
|             | Trees add challenge and beauty to the golf course landscape. Trees are quality nursery stock, approximately two inches in diameter and eight feet tall. Tree donors will be honored on a wall plaque displayed in the clubhouse.   |                |
| <b>#304</b> | <b>Golf Cart for the Physically Challenged</b>   | <b>\$4,500</b> |
|             | Thousands of physically challenged people could enjoy golf with the assistance of this vehicle. This cart is designed for a single rider to play a round of golf without leaving the cart. The rider operates the cart from a seat that swivels. In the forward seat position, the rider drives the cart. In the side position, the rider hits all the golf shots, beginning from the teeing ground until the ball is holed on the putting green. A brass donor plaque will be placed on the cart. |                |
| <b>#305</b> | <b>Water Cooler Station</b>  | <b>\$1,000</b> |
|             | Golfers look forward to a cold drink on a hot summer afternoon. This water cooler station holds ten gallons of ice-cold water. It is constructed of maintenance-free, recycled plastic lumber. A brass donor plaque will be prominently displayed.   |                |
