This bulletin is part of Longmont Police Department's Sexually Violent Predator Community Notification Program. Colorado Revised Statutes (CRS) 16-13-901 through 16-13-905, require local law enforcement to notify the community when a sex offender who meets the criteria for "Sexually Violent Predator" will be living in their community. The Longmont Police Department has no legal authority to prohibit sex offenders from living in the community.

A Sex Offender Management Board has determined that the below sex offender, **Michael Lee Vasquez**, meets the criteria for distinction as a sexually violent predator based on a psycho-sexual evaluation conducted prior to his release and, as such, he is considered to pose a greater than normal risk to the community. In addition to this bulletin, the Longmont Police department will hold a community notification meeting on July 31, 2008 to provide information and answer questions.

Current Conviction: Sexual Assault on a Child

### CURRENT STATUS:

Vasquez is required to re register quarterly as a sex offender and notify the LPD of any change in address. He has completed his sentence and is currently not under criminal justice supervision.

### GENERAL INFORMATION

As of July 28, 2008, Colorado has 10,193 registered sex offenders, and 227 of those offenders live in Longmont. 110 offenders in the State of Colorado have been evaluated and meet the criteria for Sexually Violent Predator.
